- Have a comprehensive understanding of the NH Law Enforcement Accreditation Program standards.
- Maintain a high level of professionalism at all times while representing the Commission in conducting a non-adversarial review process.
- Possess a solid understanding of modern-day policing operations and administrative practices.
- Be highly organized, detail-oriented and skilled in writing.
- Successfully pass a prescribed course of Assessor Training.
